I have seen various posts online all basically saying the same thing, this year has been really tough! Obviously, the viral pandemic that has swept the world has taken center stage. Then there was an issue between Russia and Saudi Arabia which drove the price of oil so low that it was worth basically nothing. The results on our local, state, and national economy have been devastating. Because of the radical change in social interactions many people are struggling with mental health. There has been a tremendous uptick in domestic abuse, suicide, and depression. On top of that, because of a horrible abuse of power by arresting police officers, a man was killed. This sparked outrage among many which led to peaceful protests, which then quickly led to riots, looting, and further deaths. We are only about halfway into the year, and it seems like the only direction we as a country are headed for is down.

What are we as Christians to do? Is God even concerned about what is happening? If He is really in control, then why is He allowing so much bad stuff to happen? To answer the first question, we as Christians are called to continue to be the salt and light of this world. As our country seems to continue to spin further and further out of control, now more than ever we need to be different than those around us. Matthew 5:14-16 in the ESV says:

You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.

We as Christians are called to make a difference in how we live, what we say, and even what we spend our time and money on. How this takes place will be different for all of us, but the point is that we are called to act differently from the ungodly in the culture around us.

Perhaps God is calling you to advocate for the elderly who are often left alone in their homes. Maybe God wants you to use your love of dancing and host an event for seniors who are bored and alone, so as to teach them some line dancing. Is there a young family in our community that has kids who are out of control? Ask to take them fishing with you next time you go out. Maybe there is a young couple with a struggling marriage next door. They might really benefit from a dinner with you and your spouse of 40 years of marriage. You may not feel like you have any wisdom to share, but the fact that your marriage lasted as long as it did gives you more credibility than many marriage counselors. Maybe the biggest change that needs to happen are the jokes you tell, and the slurs you have used for certain people groups. We may not have riots or civil unrest because of racism, yet it is alive and well here in Tioga. As Christians we can't ever show favoritism or disdain toward people groups. We are all created in God's image, regardless of what we look like on the outside.

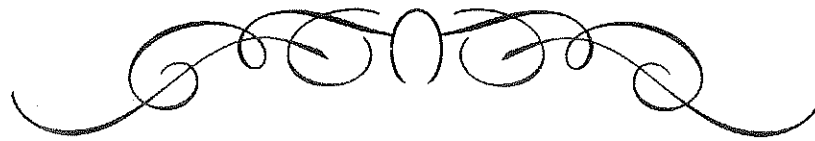
Another question many are asking is why is God allowing all this stuff to happen if He is really in control? Some wrongly believe that when bad stuff is happening to us, God isn't in control, or that God is sick and mean. The reality is that God has a way of using both good and bad events in our lives to shape us and others into the people that He wants us to be. who are called according to his purpose.” This verse reminds us that God works through all things (both good and bad things) to fulfill His purposes. In fact, some of the greatest good, has come from some of the worst possible events.

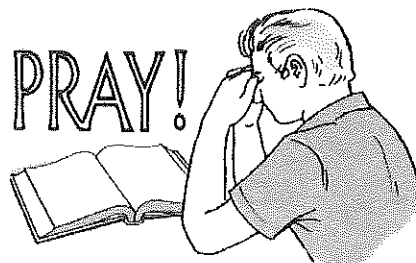
AT THE END OF THE DAY

Sent to bring out the best in you.

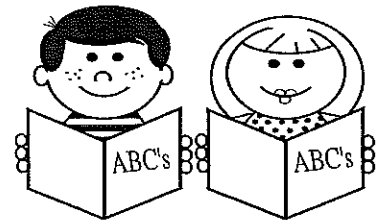

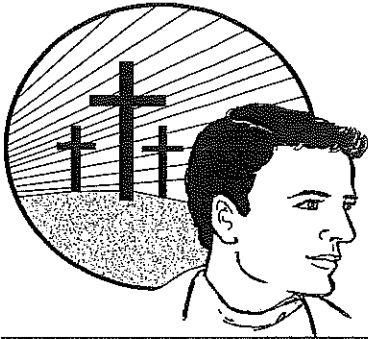

"HelloOOooo," answered Jessie, "They're watch dogs!"

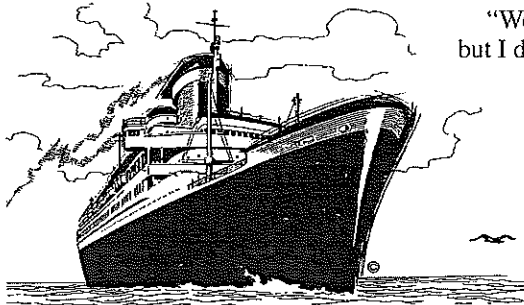


AN OCEAN LINER WAS SINKING and the captain yelled, "Does anybody know how to pray?" A minister on board said, "I do."

"Wow," said one of her pupils., "I knew Abraham Lincoln was pretty important, but I didn't know he was in the Bible too!"



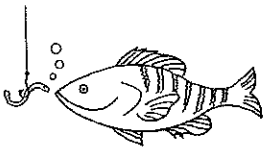
A farmer was driving along the road with a load of fertilizer. A little boy, playing in front of his house, saw him and called, "What've you got in your truck?"

"Er—right."

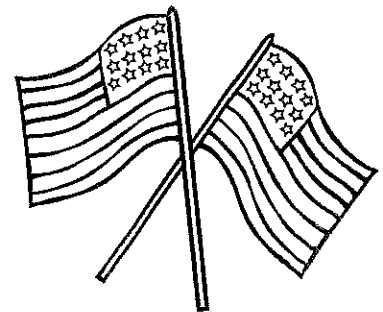

Step-By-Step Chocolate Chip Cookies

(With Three Little Helpers)

1. Get out mixer to make cookies; search through toy boxes looking for beaters. Return to find 3 "assistants" (ages 5, 2 and 1) on 3 chairs, eagerly assembled at cookie construction site. Scoot chairs apart enough to get to cabinet.
2. Get out cookie recipe; put 2 ingredients in bowl. Remove hands of helper number 3 and clean. Return to find hands of helper number 2 in bowl; clean hands of helper number 2.
3. Send helper number 1 to refrigerator for eggs; add next ingredient. Clean egg from floor while alternately adding other eggs to mixture as helper vigorously cracks them.
4. Find helper number 3 removing recipes from recipe box. Put recipes back in box in new creative order. Put recipe box back in cabinet where it should have been.
5. Back to cookies. Find helper number 1 sifting flour as directed, not necessarily into bowl. Helper number 2 decides to help helper number 1 with flour. Clean flour off cabinet, floor and helpers.
6. Change diaper of helper number 3. Return; wash hands.
7. Helper number 2 screams that she wants to be on the chair that number 3 is occupying. Helper number 3 just screams; mother screams. Helpers look shocked.
8. Add next ingredients. Get out chocolate chips. Hand everywhere! Add what chips remain to cookie mixture. Helper number 3 is covered with chocolate from head to toe. Laugh (or should that be cry). Put cookies on cookie sheet from 3 spoons and 15 different sizes and shapes. Put cookies in oven.
9. Time to clean kitchen. Helpers disappear.
10. Eat 3 dozen cookies to calm nerves.



Rhubarb Cake

1/2 c. shortening
1 1/2 c. brown sugar
1 egg
1 tsp. vanilla
1 c. sour milk

2 c. flour
1 tsp. baking soda
1/2 tsp. salt
2 c. rhubarb

TOPPING:

1/4 c. sugar
1 tsp. cinnamon

Mix the first 5 ingredients together for 5 minutes. Combine flour, baking soda, salt and rhubarb; add to first mixture. Bake in a 9x13-inch pan at 350° for about 25 to 30 minutes, until tests done. Sprinkle top with sugar and cinnamon mixture.

Fruit Salad

1 can cherry pie filling
1 (8 oz.) ctn. Cool Whip

1 can sweetened condensed milk
1/2 tsp. salt

Mix the above ingredients and refrigerate for 1 hour.
Then add:

1 (20 oz.) can crushed pineapple
1 (20 oz.) can fruit cocktail

2 sm. cans mandarin oranges
1/2 pkg. mini marshmallows

Be sure to drain the fruits well before adding to the first mixture (chopped walnuts can be added on top). Refrigerate for 3 to 4 hours. This will make a large bowl (20 servings).

Note: This will keep well in the refrigerator for several days.

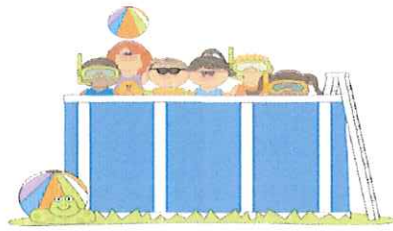


Strawberry Rhubarb Punch
